FRI. JAN 4, 7:00 PM - “CAPE SPIN ...AN AMERICAN POWER STRUGGLE”
PLUS! - “SOLARIZING OUR NEIGHBORHOODS” with NW SEED and SOLARIZE SEATTLE: NW
The surreal, fascinating, tragicomic story of the battle over what would be America's largest clean energy project, Cape Wind, & the U.S.'s first offshore windfarm. But strange alliances formed both for and against: Kennedys, Kochs, and everyday folks do battle with the developer & green groups over the future of American power. **SOLARIZE SEATTLE: NORTHWEST will show us how together we can Solarize NW Seattle.** (90 min, Robbie Gemmel & John Kirby, 2011).

FRI. JAN 11, 7:00 PM - “HAITI: WHERE DID THE MONEY GO?”
With MICHELE MITCHELL, the Film's Director; and NICOLE PHILLIPS, Staff Attorney with The Institute for Justice and Democracy in Haiti. The Jan 12, 2010 earthquake disaster in Haiti prompted an unprecedented outpouring of sympathy and assistance. Billions of dollars were pledged for immediate and long term aid and recovery. Three years later: harsh social and economic conditions still exist; hundreds of thousands are still living in squalid survivor camps. The film examines the troubling aftermath of the earthquake and asks: “WHERE DID THE MONEY GO?” **Followed by a Facilitated Discussion.** (Michele Mitchell, 53 min, 2012).

FRI. JAN 18, 7:00 PM - “ATOMIC STATES OF AMERICA”
With Guests from HANFORD CHALLENGE and WASHINGTON PHYSICIANS FOR SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY This film is a journey to nuclear reactor communities around the country to provide a comprehensive exploration of the history and impact to date of nuclear power, and to investigate the truths and myths about nuclear energy. The nation now stands at a nuclear crossroad of a possible Nuclear Renaissance. **Followed by a discussion on the latest efforts to clean up the 586-square-mile former plutonium production facility in southeastern Washington State.** (90 min, Don Argott, & Sheena M. Joyce, 2012).

FRI. JAN 25, 7:00 PM - “YOU, ME, AND THE S.P.P TRADING DEMOCRACY FOR CORPORATE RULE” A feature length documentary which exposes the latest manifestation of a corporatist agenda that is undermining the democratic authority of the citizens of North America. Proponents of the Security Prosperity Partnership (SPP) and the Trade Investment Labor Mobility Agreement (TILMA) say that these are needed to keep trade flowing. Opponents say these agreements not only undermine the democratic authority of citizens they threaten the sovereignty of the three nations. **Followed by a Facilitated Discussion on the Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP), ...think NAFTA on steroids.** (87 min, Paul Manly, 2009).
