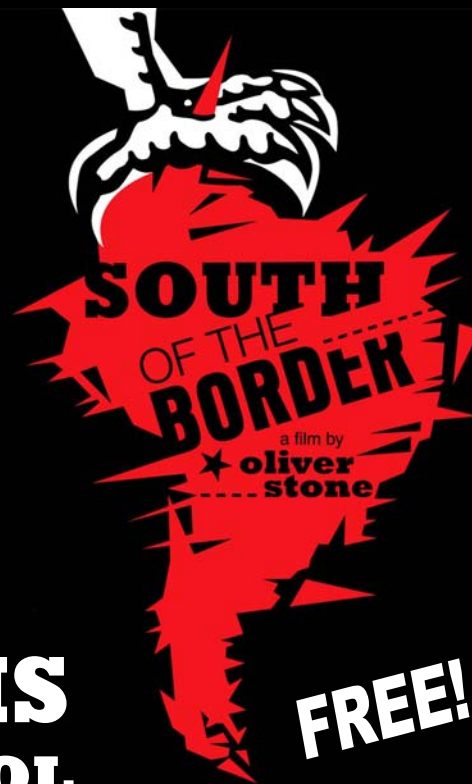

Film: “TAPPED” (76 min, Stephanie Soechtig & Jason Lindsey, 2009)

TAPPED examines the role of the bottled water industry and its' effects on our health, economy, climate change, pollution, and our reliance on oil. From the production of plastic, to the ocean in which so many bottles wind up, this film follows the path of the bottled water industry into the communities that are caught at the intersection of big business and the public right to water. TAPPED is a behind-the-scenes look into the unregulated and unseen world of an industry that aims to privatize and sell back the one resource that ought never to become a commodity: our water.

Film: “THE MOST DANGEROUS MAN IN AMERICA – DANIEL ELLSBERG” (92 min, Judith Ehrlich & Rick Goldsmith, 2009)

In 1971, Daniel Ellsberg, a leading Vietnam War strategist, concludes that America's role in the war is based on decades of lies. He leaks 7,000 pages of top-secret documents to The New York Times, a daring act of conscience that leads directly to Watergate, President Nixon's resignation and the end of the Vietnam War. Ellsberg and a who's-who of Vietnam-era movers and shakers give a riveting account of those world-changing events. Join us following the film for a facilitated discussion.

Film: “RETURN TO EL SALVADOR ” (68 min, Jamie Moffett, 2010)

RETURN TO EL SALVADOR, narrated by Martin Sheen, explores the reconstruction of El Salvador, post-civil war. The 12-year conflict (from 1980 to 1992) killed over 75,000 people and displaced nearly one-fifth of the population. The fighting, which took place between the Salvadoran Army and the leftist guerrilla organization, the FMLN, resulted in a staggering number of civilian deaths as the Salvadoran Army bombed and raided villages thought to be sympathetic to the FMLN. Many of these Salvadoran Army soldiers were trained and supported by the United States military at its School of the Americas (now known as WHINSEC), located in Ft. Benning, Georgia. It represents the power and audacity of solidarity, and challenges North Americans to question the global impact of their government on struggling nations.
