Film: “SOUTH OF THE BORDER” (78 min, Oliver Stone, 2009) **With FATHER ROY BOURGEOIS, FOUNDER OF THE SCHOOL OF THE AMERICAS WATCH, and SOAW-NORTHWEST**



There's a revolution underway in South America, but most of the world doesn't know it. Oliver Stone sets out on a road trip across five countries to explore the social and political movements as well as the mainstream media's misperception of South America while interviewing seven of its elected presidents. In casual conversations with Presidents Hugo Chávez (Venezuela), Evo Morales (Bolivia), Lula da Silva (Brazil), Cristina Kirchner (Argentina), as well as her husband and ex-President Néstor Kirchner, Fernando Lugo (Paraguay), Rafael Correa (Ecuador), and Raúl Castro (Cuba), Stone gains unprecedented access and sheds new light upon

the exciting transformations in the region.

Father Bourgeois has traveled extensively in South America, meeting with leaders and convincing many of them to withdraw support of the US School of the Americas (now known as the Western Hemisphere Institute for Security Cooperation).

Film: “TAPPED” (76 min, Stephanie Soechtig & Jason Lindsey, 2009)



TAPPED examines the role of the bottled water industry and its' effects on our health, economy, climate change, pollution, and our reliance on oil. From the production of plastic, to the ocean in which so many bottles wind up, this film follows the path of the bottled water industry into the communities that are caught at the intersection of big business and the public right to water. TAPPED is a behind-the-scenes look into the unregulated and unseen world of an industry that aims to privatize and sell back the one resource that ought never to become a commodity: our water. Film: “THE MOST DANGEROUS MAN IN AMERICA: DANIEL ELLSBERG”

In 1971, Daniel Ellsberg, a leading Vietnam War strategist, concludes that America's role in the war is based on decades of lies. He leaks 7,000 pages of top-secret documents to The New York Times, a daring act of conscience that leads directly to Watergate, President Nixon's resignation and the end of the Vietnam War. Ellsberg and a who's-who of Vietnam-era movers and shakers give a riveting account of those world-changing events. Join us following the film for a facilitated discussion.
